## SUMMER RAFFLE DRAWING

The annual summer raffle drawing was held on September 3. Naperville Police Chief Robert Marshall was on hand to pull the winning tickets.

3,781 tickets were sold this year for a total of \$28,668. This is down considerably from 2018 as a result of fewer opportunities for street sales. The committee is currently scouting additional locations to conduct street sales for 2020.

Lion Rick Butz sold the most tickets in the club with 699 tickets for a total of \$4,770. Lion Bob Hull was second with 469 tickets and \$3,805. Eight other Lions sold more than \$1,000 worth of tickets.

The competition between the Hertzberg Hackers and the Bleecker Bombers was never really close. The Hackers got out to an early lead and never looked back, snapping a long losing streak. Congratulations

to Lion Steve Hertzberg for finally getting the Burrows Cup back.

We have had very generous winners this year. The winner of the \$5,000 grand prize, Barbara R., donated \$2,500 back to the club. Susan W., winner of the \$2,000 prize donated the entire amount back to the club. This certainly helps make up for the lower ticket sales this year. Thank you to Lions Ken and Linda Strugalla for all of your hard work on this year's raffle.

### **Luncheon Speakers**

#### **WORKING BIKES**

Dave Gorman from Working Bikes was our guest speaker on September 10. Working Bikes is an organization founded 20 years ago which takes used bikes and recycles them to be given to people in need.

Working Bikes takes in over 12,000 bikes each year. All of the bikes are inspected and repaired in their shop in Chicago. Some are then sold in their store, which helps provide additional funding. Some are donated to local people in need.

Many of the bikes are shipped to the African nation of Lesotho. Dave became personally invested in this mission when he served here after college in the Peace Corps. When there, he noticed that there was almost no biking culture and he wanted to change that.

Since he began, the organization has sent thousands of bikes to this nation. Once the bikes arrive, they help locals establish bike shops where local business owners can sell the bikes to locals. The one requirement is that the first 100 bikes must be given for free to orphans.

Since beginning this mission, biking has become very popular in Lesotho. It is now the second most popular sport behind soccer. While he has made significant progress, there is still a lot of work to do. He hopes to supply the entire country with bikes, but has so far only established shops in the western part of the country.

Working Bikes has collection locations all over the area, including at Dave's house. You can view these at their website, [www.workingbikes.org](http://www.workingbikes.org). They are always looking for donations of bikes and money, as it costs approximately \$13,000 to ship a container of bikes to Lesotho, which works out to \$25 per bike.

#### **RIDE ASSIST NAPERVILLE**

On September 17, Bev Patterson and Tim Ells were our guest speakers from Ride Assist Naperville. Ride Assist Naperville is a branch off of the Naperville Senior Task Force which was created about seven years ago. Bev helped to form the Senior Task Force and continues on as an advisor.

Ride Assist Naperville came about when Tim realized that there was a need in the community for

transportation to medical appointments for seniors. They created the organization to provide affordable, dependable, and reliable transportation for this very purpose.

In order for a senior to use the service, they must be semi-mobile because most drivers are using their personal vehicles and may not have the proper space or equipment for mobility devices. The service will transport seniors to any medical appointment in the area.

All drivers are screened and required to complete a training class. Drivers use an online portal to choose routes based on those requested by the users. Drivers pick up their passengers at their homes, drive to medical appointments, wait in the lobby, and then drive the passenger back home. There is no payment at the time of the service and tipping is not allowed. Each user is billed \$12 per ride at the end of the month.

Right now, Tim is working to recruit more volunteers. Since the launch in April 2017, they have completed over 1,800 rides. He is projecting that they will soon eclipse 2,200 rides annually.
