Club News and Guest Speakers

TURKEY TROT

Thanksgiving morning welcomed our 25th annual Turkey Trot on a beautiful mild morning. We had another very successful event. Almost 6,000 runners registered and

about 5,000 finished the race. Race day morning saw dozens of people register at the last minute (some in groups of 25-30 people). This put some added stress on the registration desk, but Lion Maria handled it like a champ and got everyone registered in time.

Lion Ken Strugalla ushered the volunteers perfectly and Lion Steve Hertzberg dutifully covered the breakfast stations/volunteers with Belgio's.

The event had a gross income of approximately \$232,000, with roughly \$145,000 net to the club. Thank you to Lion Glenn Behnke for organizing another great event and to all of the Lions who worked to make it so great.

PROJECT C.U.R.E. CHAIR DONATION

Years ago, our club donated an electric-powered vision exam chair to Ann Reid Early Childhood center. They no longer use it and requested its removal.

After contacting local colleges without success, an eager recipient was found. Project C.U.R.E. is a national organization based in Colorado, which collects medical equipment and supplies and ships to locations in need. They have six warehouses around the country, including a huge one in Woodridge.

Our chair, along with much other vision-related equipment and supplies, will be packed in nine shipping containers and sent to 13

countries in Africa. The organization is amazingly effective. Just in 2022, the Woodridge facility has shipped 25 containers (at a cost of \$25,000 each) to Ukraine (12), Nigeria (7), as well as Ethiopia, Ecuador, DRC, USHS Comfort ship, Burundi, and Burkina Faso.

Also, the facility has a public drop box collecting medical equipment such as walkers and canes.

Thank you Lion Jim Woodring for all of your hard work contacting and coordinating the chair removal/donation.

LIONS VISION SCREENING

At the request of the nurse at Ann Reid Early Childhood Center, Lions Glenn Behnke, Ellen Wolff, and Jim Woodring used the Lions-owned Plusoptix 12C instrument to conduct vision screening on 152 children, aged 3 to 5. Of these, 115 passed, 12 were referred and 25 could not be tested. The Plusoptix scans and locks on the pupils and provides instant analysis of six common eye problems. It supports a wireless printer, which gives a quick summary report.

School nurses said they would be asking for testing help in the spring, with the support of an optometrist.

Another screening being conducted was for hearing. This was quite interesting, required as it child. response the The from instrument used was a Madsen Alpha. It uses the complicatedsounding principle of Distortion Otoacoustic Product **Emissions** (DPOAE). Basically, this involves introducing into the ear canal two simultaneous pure tones at slightly different frequencies. If the cochlea and tiny hair cells are in good working order, the cochlea produces a tiny distorted sound back into the ear canal, which is detected by a small microphone. Not a complete hearing test, but quite valuable for young children. Thirty-seven states require hearing tests for newborns.

HOLIDAY LUNCH

On December 13, our club gathered at Biaggi's in Naperville for our annual holiday lunch. We welcomed many significant others and guests. While the service was a bit slow, the food was delicious and Lionism was in full swing.

The club members donated piles and piles of toys for Humanitarian Service Project. Those gifts were very welcome for the holiday season.
