Luncheon Speakers

FOUNDATION FIGHTING BLINDNESS

Lion Steve Sroka was our guest speaker on January 3 to update the club on Foundation Fighting Blindness (FFB). FFB funds research for elimination of retinal degenerative diseases. They are currently funding 81 grants at 70 institutions.

FFB has 40 volunteer-led chapters throughout the country. These chapters fundraise for the organization and help raise awareness throughout their area. This includes a lot of information, education, and resources for families dealing with these diseases.

Lion Steve introduced us to a new "My Retina Tracker" initiative by FFB. This is a national registry where individuals can add themselves to the database and include specific information about their sight and situation. The tracker will help provide information and allow for easier entry into research projects/clinical trials. They also offer free genetic testing through this registry.

Lastly, Lion Steve invited our club to participate in the annual Chicago Vision Walk on June 4, 2023. This event will be held in Elk Grove Village at Busse Woods and is a great family event.

DONKA

Our club was visited by old friends Leanne Vos and Ann Byrne (and her dog, Kira) from Donka on January 10. Donka provides computer training for people with disabilities. Recently, our club provided a grant for Donka to update their computers for the first time since 2014.

Leanne provided us with an update on Donka's programs, including a job placement program and veterans' program. The job placement program has already placed six students into jobs. The veteran program is working on recruiting veterans to take advantage of their services.

Ann, a teacher at Donka, who is blind herself, told us a few stories about some of her students. She was able to help these blind students navigate the computer and become independent. Ann delighted us in recalling that one of these students insisted that she did not know what he was going through because he had no idea that she was also blind. When he learned that she, his teacher, was also blind, his attitude changed and he became incredibly proficient using his computer and confident in himself.

CHILD'S VOICE

Kate Bousum was a return guest to our club. Kate updated us on the current happenings at Child's Voice, the organization that helps deaf children learn to listen and talk through their various programs. The children use cochlear implants and/or hearing aids to hear.

Child's Voice program starts with their early intervention program, which starts at birth. They move onto the school program, which is for ages 3-8 and a classroom setting. In this program, they service children from over 30 school districts and 70 zip codes.

Recently, our club helped fund the school's social/emotional learning. This has been especially helpful coming out of COVID when the children were stuck behind a screen for the entire day.

After the children graduate from the school program, they are mainstreamed into their local school districts. The support does not end there, though. They continue to provide support and outreach well into college for their alumni. Kate was happy to report that they now have an alum on the board of directors and another teaching in the school.

BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

The Board of Directors met at Beidelman-Kunsch Funeral Home in Naperville on January 24, 2023. The following is a summary of the Board's acts and discussions. All members are welcome to attend the Board meetings. The next Board meeting will be held on February 28, 2023 at Beidelman-Kunsch Funeral Home. A copy of the complete minutes can be obtained from the Lions Club Secretary.

Approved the Board meeting minutes of the Club and Foundation for its regular meeting on December 6, 2022.

Approved the Treasurer's Report for December 31, 2022 and the six months then ended.

Approved the combined Social Service Report for December 2022 and January 2023. Expenditures totaled \$35,212 for the seven months then ended. Expenditures are approximately \$7,000 more than last year at this time and are comparable to 2019-2020. The nurses at Mill Street School inquired if the Lions could purchase a mobile phone to track a first grade diabetic student using a continuous glucose More information will be monitor. provided at a later date.

Approved the following donations:

Discussed publicity – Change in Positively Naperville advertisement needs to be made to include date, time, and location of weekly luncheons. Received an inquiry from Main and Luxe regarding article relating to Lions Clubs and NNLC. Discussed placing advertisement in Suburban Family Life magazine regarding 2023 Turkey Trot.

Approve memorial donation of \$250 in honor of Lion Ron Wigdon.

Discussed Turkey Trot results – Revised statement of receipts and disbursement have been prepared, which indicates net income of approximately \$149,000. Registration has been down in the last several years due to many 5K Turkey Trots now being held in the area around Thanksgiving and on Thanksgiving Day. It was suggested we look at radio advertising for the 2023 Turkey Trot, in addition to the traditional print media advertising.

Discussed membership – All members are current in dues. A possible new member from the Naperville Bank and Trust will attend today's lunch. Follow up with prospects continues.

Discussed spring flower fundraising event. Plans are in progress to hold the flower sale this year in early spring.

Approved expenditure of \$100 for advertisement in the Lions Convention program for this spring's convention.
