Luncheon Speakers

SAMARACARE

Bill Peterson. Director of Development for SamaraCare, was our quest speaker on June 6. SamaraCare was founded in 1971 by three Naperville congregations to fill the need for unmet mental health care in the area. Today, they are one of the largest non-profit counseling organizations servina Chicagoland.

SamaraCare's mission is to help people achieve their potential with counseling. They serve almost all ages, but mostly work with children and seniors. They serve all of the Chicago collar counties and served 2,800 people last year.

SamaraCare provides counseling services in all types of areas. They provide some services to local organizations and churches. They help people who are unable to afford counseling services by providing subsidized care. They do charge for services so that each individual has a stake, even if it may only be a few dollars. Last year, they provided subsidies of \$547,738 to their clients.

SamaraCare provides its services to other organizations at a contracted discount rate. They have a staff of 44, which includes 34 counselors. In 2022, they delivered 27,657 clinical hours of service.

Naperville is their largest market served. Bill was proud to inform us that SamaraCare spends 84% of all money collected directly on programs.

EDWARD HOSPITAL CHILD LIFE

Nina Sittler was our guest speaker on June 20 to provide the club with an update on Edward Hospital's Child Life program. Our club has been donating comfort toys to the unit since 2014.

The Child Life department works to normalize the hospital experience for children. They see every child who is inpatient at the hospital and have started working with the surgery and outpatient units, as well.

Her department provides play, preparation, distraction, and coping services for the children and their families. Nina believes that play is very important for these children. They use play as a method for preparing and teaching the children about the medical procedures they will encounter.

The department also provides celebrations for children in the hospital, like birthday parties. They work with other organizations like ours to provide their services as they do not have a budget within the hospital. _____

BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

The Board of Directors met at Aurelio's of Naperville on June 27, 2023. The following is a summary of the Boards acts and discussions. All members are welcome to attend the Board meetings. The next Board meeting will be held on July 25, 2023, at Aurelio's of Naperville starting at 11:00 a.m. A copy of the complete minutes can be obtained from the Lions Club Secretary.

Club President Strugalla thanked departing Board members, Lions Jim Ebers, Paul Rewerts, Maria Wilson, and Bob Hull for their hard work and many years of service on the Board.

Approved the Board meeting minutes of the Club and Foundation for its regular meeting on May 23, 2023, as corrected for the number of new Board members.

Approved the Treasurer's Report for May 31, 2023 and the eleven months then ended.

Approved the Social Service Report for June 2023. Expenditures for the year ended June 30, 2023 totaled \$58,375. Discussed a patient that was referred to Aurora Lions Club who was refused services. Naperville Lions provided the needed services. Discussed the difference in amounts reported as expenditures on the Social Service Report and Treasurer's Report. Difference is due to how payments are recorded. It was the consensus of the Board not to change this method of reporting expenditures.

Publicity – Discussed follow-up with NCTV-17 regarding appearance on Spotlight Show. Monthly advertisement continues to run in Positively Naperville.

Membership – One member owes dues for the first quarter. \$50 has been received in dues for the month of June. Overdue invoices were sent to three members on June 25. Next quarter dues invoices will be sent on July 1. Follow up with potential members continues. No resignations for the month of June.

Discussed Naperville All Service Club Community Project. Meeting date has not been scheduled yet. Lion Tom Garvey visited Huntley Lions Club Health Fair to get ideas for the service project.

Discussed Summer Raffle – All raffle tickets have been distributed to members. All street sales locations have been scheduled, except one date in July. Cash collections are on pace with last year. Raffle chairman encouraged all members to keep up the good work.

Discussed Turkey Trot – Timing contract with Lake Shore is in process, all information has been submitted to the Naperville Central High School for use of their facilities, and audio contract is still pending. All above contracts should be finalized soon.

Discussed Bake Sale – Signup sheets for baked goods is available. Bake sale will be on July 27.

Discussed community service project with Families helping Families and Go Brewing Company. The event kicked off on June 24. Collection of goods at the installation dinner and goods collected at Go Brewing was enough to fill a van. Event will run through July 20 at Go Brewing.

Discussed Free Library Program. The Program was rejected by both the Naperville River Walk Commission and the Naperville Park District. The Program will be on hold unless a suitable location can be found.

Discussed the Lymphoma Walk. Several volunteers are still needed. The date of the event is July 28. Discussed the 75th anniversary pins. The pins have been completed and were distributed to each Board member. Approximately 150 pins were ordered and are available to Club members. The consensus of the Board was the pins turned out beautifully. The Board thanked Lion Steve Hertzberg for his work to create the new pins.

Approved the Club's fiscal year 2023/24 fiscal year budget as corrected for Dot Easy and Google Hosting expenditures.

Approved the Foundation's fiscal year 2023/24 budget as submitted. Total targeted donations approximate \$191,000. Discussed increases to several organizations.

Discussed Eagle Scout project. Possible collection of eyeglasses. Lion Cornish will coordinate the project and obtain more information for July Board meeting.

Discussed trash pickup project. Lions are conducting trash pick-up along Naperville/Plainfield Road. Next pick up is scheduled for August 8.

The Board thanked Lion Linda Strugalla for her hard work and outstanding year as Club President.
