

Luncheon Speakers

NORMAL MOMENTS

On June 6, Patricia Fragen was our speaker. Patricia founded her organization, Normal Moments, as a tribute to her daughter, who she lost to cancer.

When Patricia's daughter, Melissa, was ill, she had a family friend named David. David helped the family during Melissa's treatment by watching over and caring for their home. By taking care of these household tasks, David allowed Patricia to spend much more time with her sick daughter.

After Melissa passed away, Patricia wants to help other similar families. She started Normal Moments to help families with critically ill children. Volunteers in the program help families with tasks like house cleaning, lawn mowing, and meal preparation. The real gift the volunteers give is quality time for families to be together.

The organization is 100% volunteerrun. All volunteers are completely vetted with a background check and meetings with Patricia. Any fundraising goes to overhead costs and to pay for professional services when a volunteer is not available.

Most families are referred by social workers. Normal Moments does not restrict by diagnosis, the family is only required to have a child under 18. They serve all of northern Illinois and serve approximately 300 families at any one time.

NAPERVILLE AREA HUMANE SOCIETY

On June 13, Anna Payton was our speaker. Anna is the Executive Director of the Naperville Area Humane Society, which is a local non-profit.

The Naperville Area Humane Society is a limited admission shelter for dogs and cats. This means that they only take in the animal if there is space. They do not euthanize animals unless they are sick or dangerous.

Anna works with local animal control centers, which is where they get many of their animals. They also run an owner surrender program, but that has a wait list. They work with owners to help them keep their animals if possible.

They operate a Safe Pets Program for victims of domestic violence. They will take in pets so that a victim does not feel tied to the house where the abuser lives. This is especially helpful because shelters usually do not allow pets and abusers use the pets as a pawn.

They have started a Positive Future Program with the Warrenville Juvenile Detention Center. The Humane Society brings dogs in for the kids to train. It helps the kids learn about positive reinforcement provides and а sense of achievement. This also helps the doas thev become as more adoptable once trained.

Anna told us that they have stopped breeds because it labeling is impossible to be 100% accurate without a DNA test. The animals are vaccinated, spayed/neutered, and micro-chipped before being placed Through adoption. the for assistance of 500 volunteers, they are able to help 700 animals per year.

The Board of Directors met on June 27, 2017 at Beidelman-Kunsch Funeral Home in downtown The following is a Naperville. summary of the Board's actions and discussions. All members are welcome the Board to attend meetings, which start at 7:30 a.m. The next Board meeting will be held on July 25, 2017.

Lion Phil Barnum was welcomed to the Board as a new member.

Approved the Club and Foundation Board minutes for the meeting of May 23, 2017.

Approved the minutes of the annual membership meeting of May 23, 2017.

Approved the Treasurer's Report as of May 31, 2017 and the Social Service Report as of June 27, 2017. There were 18 new cases opened for the month and 435 cases opened for the year to date compared to 445 cases opened for the previous year to date. Expenditures for the year to date totaled \$107,350 for 351 closed cases.

Approved the transfer from full membership to at-large membership for Lions Rich Williams and Jane Bowers.

Approved the Club and Foundation budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

Approved year end grant distributions in the amount of \$71,390 which included \$6,572 carried over till next year.

Approved fiscal year 2017/18 grant distributions of \$227,155 with the suggestion that an additional \$6,000 be allocated to Feed My Starving Children, if funds are available.

Raffle – We are ahead of last year and everything is going well.

RibFest - more volunteers are needed, weather does not look good.
