Club News and Guest Speakers

TURKEY TROT

On a cool and dry Thanksgiving morning, the 20th Turkey Trot went off without a hitch. Thanks to the hard work of the Turkey Trot Committee and all of the volunteers, the race was a tremendous success.

A total of 7,671 runners registered. Of those, 7,551 were paid runners (the others were sponsor slots). A total of 6,797 runners finished the which race. is а very hiah The majority of the percentage. runners were Naperville residents, but a total of 39 states and 4 countries were represented. Our oldest participant was 89 years old and the youngest was 8 months old.

More than 350 volunteers were on hand on race day and during the preceding week for packet pickup. A total of 22 organizations supplied volunteers.

There were 42 total sponsors. The gross receipts from those sponsors totaled \$32,500. Many sponsors were so happy with the event that they have already committed to returning in 2018.

The gross receipts from the runners totaled approximately \$262,000. Following expenses, the club should make about \$200,000.

This year's race had a Zumba warmup given by Lion Nadia Esmail just before the race, which was a success. The race also created Snapchat filters for use during the race. Runners used the Snapchat filters 643 times and those photos/videos were seen 38,117 times.

The earnings from this event will help the club support its charitable mission for the next year. The Turkey Trot Committee did a fantastic job and deserves a great deal of praise. The Committee is already looking forward to 2018 where the race will see its 100,000th runner.

SALVATION ARMY

On November 25, our club manned the Salvation Army bucket and rang bells during the afternoon. Those who volunteered enjoyed a new location in front of the newly opened Starbucks on Jefferson and Main. The club was able to raise money that will benefit the Salvation Army. The Board of Directors met on December 5, 2017 at Beidelman-Kunsch Funeral Home in downtown Naperville. The following is a summary of the Board's actions and discussions. All members are welcome to attend the Board meetings, which start at 7:30 a.m. The next Board meeting will be held on January 30, 2018.

Approved the Club and Foundation minutes for the meeting of October 24, 2017.

Approved the Treasurer's Report as of October 31, 2017.

Approved the Social Service Report as of December 5, 2017 which indicated total expenditures for the year totaled \$47,082 compared to \$43,256 for the prior year.

Approved the following donations:

- Naperville Christian Academy \$500
- Boy Scouts **\$250**
- Humanitarian Service Project
 Senior Citizens Project
 \$800
- Feed My Starving Children \$7,500

Approved Lion Jim Ebers to replace Lion Phil Barnum as Membership Chair and Dues Secretary.

Approved the nomination of Lion Carl Smith for Honorary Lifetime Membership in the Naperville Noon Lions Club pending his acceptance of change of membership status.

Discussed the request of adding a link to NNLC website from Caring 4 our Kids. The request was rejected as their mission was not compatible with that of the missions of the Lions.

Approved the donation of 60% of net receipts from this year's Candy Day to Lions of Illinois Foundation. \$3,156 will be donated to LIF and \$2,105 will be retained by the Naperville Noon Lions Foundation.

Discussed the possibility of having another Candy Day in late April if approved by the City of Naperville. Discussed the final results of the Turkey Trot. It is estimated that net income will approximate \$200,000.

Approved the termination of the Club's participation in the Naperville Exchange Club's 2018 Rib Fest event.

Discussed the Lion's Club eye glass collection box. The box will be moved from the Naperville Township Offices to the Naperville Downtown Post Office pending the approval of the Post Master and the Naperville Community Bank.

Approved a half-page advertisement in the Lions District 1-J Convention ad book in the amount of \$60.
