Luncheon Speakers

SENIOR STAR

On January 9, Elizabeth Bardeman was our speaker. Elizabeth is the executive director of Senior Star Weber Place, a senior living community in Romeoville.

Weber Place sits on 29 acres and is one of 14 Senior Star locations in the United States. They currently serve 280 residents.

Senior Star provides a variety of living options. They provide adult day care, which is an opportunity for care givers to get a break. They provide home healthcare for medical and non-medical needs.

Senior Star has senior-only housing that takes on a variety of shapes and sizes. There is an independent living component, which is essentially an apartment. There is also the option for assisted living where nurse care is provided. They also run a dementia care program and short and long term rehabilitation.

Services are paid primarily by the residents themselves. This can take the shape of individual assets or savings. They also accept Social Security and veteran income, as well as Medicaid.

SECOND SENSE

Cheryl Megurichian from Second Sense was our guest speaker on January 16. Second Sense was founded in 1947 and its focus is vision rehabilitation training. They cater to adults who have suffered vision loss later in life.

Trainers work one-on-one or in small groups in their Chicago facility or in the client's home. They begin with mobility training in order to help the client navigate the home and use the white cane.

Second Sense is proud of its onetouch self-defense training. This has been specially designed for the blind. With this training, confidence in public increases dramatically.

They provide technology training. This works out to be mostly using the iPhone or iPad with voiceover. This allows use of all apps using text to voice.

All staff members at Second Sense are professionally trained and certified in their individual field. All services are provided for free. Funding comes from the government, foundation, and earned income. The services are available for adults only and the majority served are over 40.

DUPAGE COUNTY

On January 30, our club welcomed Janice Anderson and Gwen Henry as guest speakers. Janice is a member of the DuPage County Board and Gwen is the DuPage County Treasurer.

Janice was elected as a board member in November 2016. She represents District 5, which is comprised of Naperville, Lisle, and Aurora. She ran for the Board because she wanted to be involved in good fiscal policy.

Janice explained that the budget is nearly \$40 million lower than it was in 2010 and that there has not been an increase in their property tax levy in 10 years.

The County handles a variety of services including public safety, jail, court system, transportation, emergency management, and the health department.

The Board has worked to reduce the budget through cost cutting and consolidation.

Gwen has been the DuPage County Treasurer for 11 years. While in office, she has updated many of the systems to make them run more efficiently.

Gwen told the club about the end of the year rush to get property taxes paid. She saw 20,000 people come in and pay property taxes early in an effort to see a tax benefit. Her department collected \$225 million in tax payments at the end of the year due to this influx. She used some help from other departments and was able to process all of these payments without much of a hitch.
