The project began in June 2014. Through April 2018, 22 deliveries have been made for a total of 2,205 items. Cost has been a modest \$1.14 per item.

Luncheon Speakers

DIVEHEART

Jim Elliot from Diveheart was our guest speaker on June 5. Jim worked in the Chicago media business for years prior to founding Diveheart. To date, Diveheart has spun off to 39 groups throughout the world. Currently, much of their work involves training other divers to assist special needs participants.

Jim has found that individuals with spinal cord injuries have seen great improvements in pain with diving. Once they reach a certain depth, the body releases serotonin which can help relieve pain for a period of time following the dive.

Jim showed the group a series of videos from various news outlets who aired pieces about Diveheart. These videos included firsthand accounts of the effects Diveheart has had on its participants.

STRESS MANAGEMENT

On June 12, Anna Walters was our guest speaker. Anna is the Director of Health Services at Senior Star at Weber Place. Anna spoke with the club about stress and how to deal with it.

Stress can be acute or chronic. Acute stress is evolutionary and helps to keep us alive during emergency situations. Chronic stress is with us constantly and becomes unhealthy over time. Chronic stress can lead to a diminished immune system, obesity, heart disease, high blood pressure, and headaches.

One can identify when suffering from chronic stress. Chronic stress can cause an increased temper, bad eating habits, forgetfulness, sleep disruption, anxiety, etc.

Anna informed us that everyone has a different method for responding to stress. It is important to set realistic expectations and build stress relief into one's schedule. Seeking supportive relationships and expressing feelings in a healthy manner will also help.
