The event was the idea of a group of reinsurance executives in New York City, all with Irish roots. For years, they had been observing St. Patrick's Day in the traditional way; pints at their favorite pub, with music and laughter in great supply. In appreciation for their own good fortune, they decided to find a way to help others, specifically children with cancer.

On March 17, 2000, they turned their annual St. Patrick's Day party into the first St. Baldrick's event. They collected donations from people willing to see them and other volunteers shaved bald at the party, with funds going to research to find cures. Their bald heads would be a symbol of solidarity with kids fighting cancer. To their surprise, they far surpassed their \$17,000 goal, raising \$100,000! And that was only the beginning! Over the past 7 years, over \$20 million has been raised to fight childhood cancer, with thousands of shavees from all walks of life participating in hundreds of events.
